### What Happens to the Pills?

When the pill boxes need to be emptied the Allegany County Sheriff's Office empties the boxes. The pills are weighed to keep a total of pharmaceuticals kept off our streets and to estimate the success of each pill drop location. Once the Sheriff's Office has collected an adequate amount of pills, they are transported to an incinerating location in Niagara Falls, New York. By incinerating the unused or unwanted pharmaceuticals it helps keep pharmaceuticals out of our water supplies.

## Why Drop Off Prescription Pills?



#### **Nature**

For years unused or unwanted medications have been disposed of down drains, which results

in them ending up in our local water supplies, rivers and lakes.

In 2002, a U.S. Geological Survey report showed that 80% of surface water samples taken nationwide contained one or more pharmaceutical or personal care product.

Studies by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) have shown striking effects on aquatic life caused by high levels of medications in U.S. waterways.

Studies have shown significant levels of pharmaceuticals in people who eat large quantities of fish or seafood.

### **Misuse and Abuse**

Medicines that languish in home cabinets are highly susceptible to



diversion, misuse, and abuse. Rates of prescription drug abuse in the U.S. are

alarmingly high—more Americans currently abuse prescription drugs than the number of those using cocaine, hallucinogens, and heroin combined, according to the 2009 National Survey on Drug Use and Health.

Studies show that teens who abuse prescription drugs often obtain them from family and friends, including from the home medicine cabinet. In addition, many Americans do not know how to properly dispose of their unused medicine, often flushing them down the toilet or throwing them away – both potential safety and health hazards.
